














# In research, like in any thing else The end results DOES NOT justify the means!





















### What is ethics

- Rules of behavior based on ideas about what is morally good and bad
- A diverse set of values, norms
   & institutional regulations
   that help to constitute &
   regulate scientific activity

### Origin of the word ETHICS



- The word is derived form the Greek word "ethos" meaning; "the set of moral principles"
- Morality or ethics represents a <u>code of conduct</u> that governs how people treat each other.
- In essence, it is concerned with the way people should act or behave.
- The term 'ethics' usually refers to the moral principles, guiding conduct, which are held by a group or even a profession"























 Bioethics is a way of understanding and examining the moral aspects of biomedical research and practice

#### **HUMAN SUBJECT**

- "A living individual about whom an investigator (professional or student) conducting research to obtains;
- 1. Data

or

2. Identifiable private information

Through intervention or interaction with the individual."

45 CFR 46.102(f)





















#### WHAT IS RESEARCH?

 Research is defined as; "a systematic investigation, including research development, testing and evaluation, designed to develop or contribute to <u>GENERALIZABLE</u> knowledge."

• 45 CFR 46.102(d)





















#### What is health research?

There are many different types of health research "health research" may be defined as:

"any research which contributes to the knowledge of –

- The biological, clinical, psychological or social processes in human beings
- 2. Improved methods for the provision of health services
- 3. Human pathology
- 4. The causes of disease
- 5. The effects of the environment on the human body
- 6. The development or new application of pharmaceuticals, medicines or related substances
- The development of new applications of health technology".



















#### **HUMAN SUBJECT RESEARCH**



A research Involving living individuals about whom the researcher obtains:



Data through Intervention or Interaction

AND OR

Identifiable Human Material &/Private Information

Research is a privilege, not a right The well-being of participant is a priority


















